

UNRESTRICTED & RESTRICTED REPORTING



Unrestricted Reporting

Victims of domestic abuse who wish to pursue an official investigation of the incident should use standard reporting channels, such as their chain-of-command, Family Advocacy Program (FAP), or law enforcement.

ALL REPORTS of child abuse are unrestricted reports.

Restricted Reporting

Victims can receive victim advocacy services, such as referrals, information and safety planning, as well as clinical treatment.

There is no command or law enforcement involvement.

Adult victims of domestic abuse who desire to exercise the restricted reporting option, must report the abuse to one of the following specified individuals:

Restricted reporting can encourage victims to feel more comfortable about reporting domestic abuse.

Disclosures made by adult victims in the presence of individuals not specified to the left, may result in an unintended unrestricted report.
